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Board changes calculator policy for TMSCA contests only

The issue of which calculators are allowed on the high school science test has been around for a very long time. Many of us veteran UIL and TMSCA science coaches can remember a list of "authorized calculators" that UIL maintained. That list had about 20 different models on it, and before each contest, coaches had to check that students were using calculators on the approved list.

As more calculator models became available, it became impossible to maintain a current list of approved calculators. UIL changed its policy to allow all calculators with the provision that the calculators must be cleared before the contest. TMSCA followed UIL's lead and used the same policy. Again, I am sure that many of you remember going into a science contest, walking around the room and clearing calculators before the contest began.

About six years ago, UIL updated its calculator policy, going back to an approved calculator list consisting of only three models. (They have since expand the list to include a fourth model.) Once again, TMSCA followed their lead and changed our policy as well.

In visiting with the UIL Science contest directors about the calculator policy, one common thread that emerged

was the concern that new graphing calculators would give students a competitive advantage. They expressed concerned about the ability to store equations and other information in graphing calculators. One past contest director was concerned that students could load an entire biology textbook in the calculator and access the information during the contest.

In my role as a science coach and State Contest Director for TMSCA, I have the opportunity to visit with many Continued on page 2

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Board changes TMSCA calculator policy

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coaches. We sit and talk during the contest at practice meets, District, Regional and State meets. I have heard from many successful coaches about their views on calculators. What I have found is that an overwhelming majority of UIL and TMSCA science coaches do not think that the model of the calculator a student uses will provide a meaningful difference in the outcome of the contest.

Science coaches who attend contests week in and week out agree that if a student relies on information stored in the calculator, that student will not be competitive. The time constraint placed on students to answer 60 questions in two hours is tremendous. We may think two hours is a long time, but try working through a Regional or State test in that amount of time. It is difficult, and students are pressed for time. A student wanting to look up equations or other information during the contest will have a distinct disadvantage compared to other contestants.

Therefore, TMSCA will conduct an experiment for the 2022-2023 school year for the high school science contest. We are changing our policy to allow for ANY CALCULATOR during the science contest. Calculators *will not* need to be cleared. This is a departure from the UIL contest rules. TMSCA has always followed UIL's lead when it comes to contests rules; however, we want to make this change because we think it will make the science contest a better contest.

First, students use graphing calculators daily. They use it in their math, chemistry and physics classes. It seems odd not to allow that during a contest. Second, we want to collect data during the 2022-2023 school year and determine whether using graphing calculators will affect the outcome of contests. The process of including or excluding certain calculators have been based on anecdotal evidence. We have not had any data to support our decisions. We hope that this will provide some evidence.

I understand that a change like this may cause confusion for some. I hope that the disruptions will be minimal as we try to improve the science contest.
